
The FIRST Commandment




"Thou shalt have no other gods before Me."

Long, long ago, the Jews were slaves in Egypt. They suffered under the cruel Pharaoh.

When Moses was 80 years old, God told him to go to Egypt to deliver the Nation of Israel out this bondage.



With Moses as their leader, the children of Israel left Egypt and traveled to Mt. Sinai. It took them three months to reach the wilderness of Sinai, and they camped in front of the mountain.

How quickly the people forgot the promise they made to God and all His goodness to them.




When Moses came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the Law, he saw the people dancing around the golden calf.











The SECOND Commandment



"Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image..."


Exodus 20:4-5

God's prophet Elijah saw that Israel was trying to worship two Gods. Elijah called the people, together with the false prophets of Baal, and said . . .




The Second Commandment said that Israel must not make graven images to worship. But the children of Israel burned offerings to both the True God, Jehovah . . .

Then the prophets of Baal prayed and prayed to their god. "Oh great Baal! Send down fire to consume our offering to you! Please! Oh great Baal! Show Elijah and all of Israel that you are a mighty god!"

So, all the Nation saw God's answer to Elijah's prayer. Then the people fell on their faces and cried, "The Lord, He is THE God."












The THIRD Commandment




"Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain . . ."

Exodus 20:7

God's 3rd Commandment to Israel was. "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain . . . " Exodus 20:7 This was another very important commandment given to the Jews. God is pleased if we truly understand what it means.




Taking God's name "in vain" can mean many things. One meaning is when we hear people say God's name as a swear word — using His name with disrespect.




Taking God's name "in vain" by swearing is called "profanity."
When people swear, it shows that they really don't know and love God the way we do. Soon they will learn to truly love God, when His Kingdom is established on earth as it is in heaven.



Taking God's name "in vain" can also happen when someone says something evil or untrue about God's character. Some people laugh about God and tell jokes about Him. When people make fun of God or say bad things about Him, this is called "blasphemy."



We learn to love and respect God more and more every day, because we know He is the loving Creator of all things. We show God how much we love Him by respecting His holy name and character.

One other way that God's name is taken "in vain" is when someone says they love God, and yet, they live bad lives — hurting others and being prideful and selfish.



Jesus spoke about people who claimed to worship and love God, but who were very bad in their hearts. He called these people "hypocrites."




The Scribes and Pharisees of Jesus' day were outwardly very holy, but Jesus could see in their hearts that they were prideful, selfish men.



Only Jesus and God can judge people's hearts now. We must love people and be forgiving, because we do not know their heart intentions. Most people do not intend to hurt others by being selfish. In God's Kingdom, almost everyone will learn to be good Christian examples.



2 Corinthians 3:6 teaches Christians that they are not "bound by the law" of the Jews. But, even though this is true, they do live by the "spirit of the law." We should be good Christian examples, so that we can show everyone what it is like to really love God and His Son, Jesus.




We are good examples to others when we smile and are courteous . . .

We are also good examples when we tell others of all the good things God has done for all of mankind through His faithful Son, Jesus . . .




... and also when we take good care of all that we have been given.



Exodus 20:8-11






74 Jesus was the only Jew to ever keep all of the Commandments given to the Nation of Israel. He was perfect in every way.






76 The lesson found in Israel's 4th

beautiful lessons to Christians today.
It teaches us about God's plan for a
Kingdom in which all mankind will rest
from pain, suffering and death.



Each 1,000 year period is considered a day to God. mankind has lived on earth for about 6,000 years. Since God created Adam and Eve,



mankind will rest from all sickness, sin and sorrow. the 7th one thousand year day — On the Great Sabbath Day —



the Great Sabbath Day called the Millennial Kingdom. We can see that very soon, mankind will know that they are in the 7th thousand year day –

Jesus healed many people on the 7th day of the week – the Sabbath. The Scribes and Pharisees criticized Jesus for this, because they said Jesus was working on the day of rest. But Jesus explained that God provided the Sabbath Day for man's good and not for a ritual.




Jesus healed the people to show us lessons of the beautiful things that will happen on the Great Sabbath Day.
Then, in God's Kingdom on earth, all the world will be healed.




One day, on the Sabbath, Jesus saw a man with a withered hand. Jesus said, "Stretch forth thine hand," and he healed the withered hand. The man then had two healthy hands with which to work to God's glory.

"Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity." And the woman stood up straight and praised God. Luke 13:11-13








Jesus and God want all of us to be healthy and happy, but right now we live in an evil world where Satan and those who follow him cause much pain and suffering.



God is permitting this for a time so that we will learn to love Him and His righteousness, and so that we will learn to hate sin and the trouble that disobedience causes.






God will grant all righteous men and women eternal life at the end of the Millennium.






God loves us one and all, We see it every spring: The little flowers That lift their heads And pretty birds that sing.

98 Abraham was a very righteous man who served God faithfully. Abraham and his wife were very old and thought that they would never be able to have children.

But, when Abraham was 100 years old, God blessed Sarah and him with a son. Sarah was too old to have children, so the child was a miracle from God.



100 They named their son Isaac, which means laughter, because Isaac brought them great joy, and because Sarah laughed when the angel of the Lord told her that she would give birth to a son.




They loved Isaac very much. As Isaac grew older, he grew to love, honor and respect his parents very much, too.



When Isaac grew to be a young man, God tested Abraham to prove whether he loved God above everything else.







Isaac loved and honored his father and God so much that he let Abraham bind his hands and put him on the altar. This was a wonderful example of faith, trust and obedience.



Abraham raised the knife and was ready to slay Isaac, when he heard the angel of the Lord call to him.





The angel of the Lord called to Abraham again and told him God's message: "Because you have not withheld your son, your only son from me . . . in your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice." Genesis 22:16-18 (See Page 119) 108



Jesus was also a good example, because he loved and honored his mother and father. Even though Joseph was not his natural father, Jesus loved and honored him, because Joseph helped him like our fathers help us when we grow.





So, they went back to Jerusalem and found Jesus in the Temple questioning and listening to the teachers of the Law.



Jesus was learning more of his Heavenly Father's plans for him, so that he could serve God better. He wanted to stay longer, but he obeyed Joseph and Mary and went home with them. He was obeying God by obeying his parents.









Adam and Eve are the parents of all mankind.

die because of Adam's sin.





Law of Love given to Christians.






No one has the right to hurt or destroy another person's life, or to do harm to their own life, because life is a precious gift from God.





The Bible tells when the first murder of another human life took place. If we look in the first book of the Bible, Genesis Chapter Four, we will find the story of this very sad event.



Cain and Abel were two sons of Adam and Eve. Cain was older than Abel. When they grew up, they wanted to give praise to God, and each gave an offering of what they thought would be pleasing to Him.



Cain offered grain on his altar to the Lord, and Abel offered a lamb. God was pleased with Abel's offering, because a lamb has blood which pictures life. But, God did not accept Cain's offering, because grain does not picture life.






This made Cain so angry that he killed his brother. There, the first murder took place. Even though the Law had not yet been given to the Nation of Israel, and Cain was not under the Law of the 6th Commandment, this murder was still



We should be careful not to be angry with others when we see that they have done something better than we can do. This is jealousy and can lead to terrible thoughts in our minds about another person. We should be happy for others when they do good. We should give the person a compliment.



Do you remember that God warned Adam not to disobey, or Adam would receive the penalty of death? God permitted Jesus to be killed on the cross so that the shedding of his blood in death would one day pay the penalty for the sin of Adam, and all of Adam's children.

The shed blood of the precious lamb pictured something very precious to God—life—the precious life of Jesus.




was an acceptable sacrifice, so was Jesus' death acceptable to God. Jesus willingly gave his life in sacrifice to God.





But, Jesus' death means much more, because he was a perfect man who was obedient to God in every way.

The shedding of his blood and the giving of his life paid the price to buy back the life that Adam lost when he sinned. This is what the word "ransom" means: a perfect human life (Christ) paid for a perfect human life lost (Adam).



God provided for Adam and Eve to be married so that they could have children and begin to fill the earth with people. Genesis 1:27-28





198 We know that Jesus was a good and honest man. But some of the Scribes and Pharisees didn't like Jesus, because the goodness of Jesus made them look bad.


Jesus said, "Everyone that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved."







He was also very prideful, and he coveted his father David's throne and Kingdom.








So, Absalom took the throne in Jerusalem away from his father. King David had to flee for his life, and all of those who loved David left with him.






When King David's servants saw this, they killed Absalom. David grieved over the death of his son, but because Absalom was removed from the throne, David was free to return to Jerusalem as King.




Absalom's greediness—his covetousness led to his death and caused many people to be hurt, as well.



"Pride goeth before destruction and a haughty spirit before the fall." Proverbs 16:18




Satan is another example of one who has been covetous. Just like Absalom, Lucifer wants or covets his Father's throne and Kingdom. Isaiah 14:13-14





